Researchers are conducting a study to evaluate an investigational drug for spasticity in people with MS.

Researchers want to find out more about a drug called Arbaclofen. The purpose of this study is to test the safety and tolerability (positive and negative effects) of the study drug and whether or not it affects spasticity symptoms.

Multiple sclerosis or MS is a disease that affects the brain and spinal cord, resulting in loss of muscle control, vision, balance, and sensation (such as numbness).

Spasticity is a common complication in MS occurring in up to 84% of patients and is characterized by involuntary muscle movement (spasm) and resistance to stretching.



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What is a clinical trial?

A clinical trial is a type of research study. Without clinical trials, treatment for diseases and conditions could not improve. What is learned from trials helps doctors develop better options for diagnosing and treating.

Clinical trial participation is voluntary. You do not have to participate in the studies to receive treatment for your condition. If you do choose to participate, you can leave a trial at any time without it affecting the medical care you receive from your regular doctor.

By participating in the trial, you would be making an important contribution to Multiple Sclerosis disease research that could one day change the way the disease is treated.

About our Multiple Sclerosis Study

If you agree to participate in this voluntary research study and meet all of the conditions required, the length of time of your participation will be approximately 5 months. During this time, you will be required to make 10 visits to your study doctor.

Study doctors and their staff will keep your health information private. Details about your health will not be shared without your permission or except as required by law. Your study visits will be held in medical offices under the supervision of a study doctor and will meet all legal and regulatory rules



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To take part in this voluntary research study, you must:

- Be between 18 and 65 years of age
- Have been diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis
- Experience Spasticity

There are other eligibility criteria that the study doctor or staff will review with you.

All trial-related visits, tests, and study drug will be provided to participants at no cost. In addition, reimbursement for travel may also be provided.

The trial staff is always available to answer any questions or concerns you may have about these trials or the study drug evaluation in general.



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
